Reeghn said "Pig the Pug was my favourite book. I liked it when Pug fell off all his toys and he started to share".



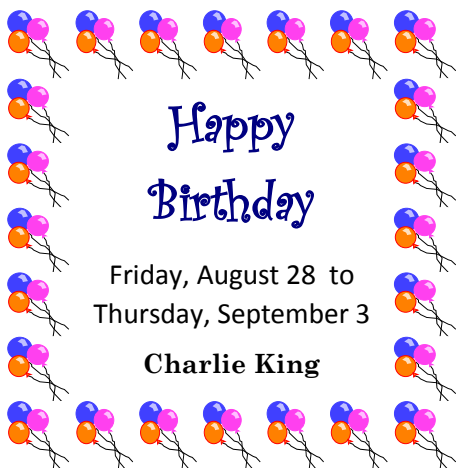
## Strings Performance & Morning Assembly next week

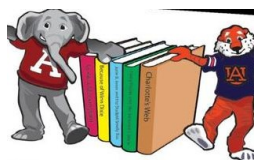
### Legacy Week
